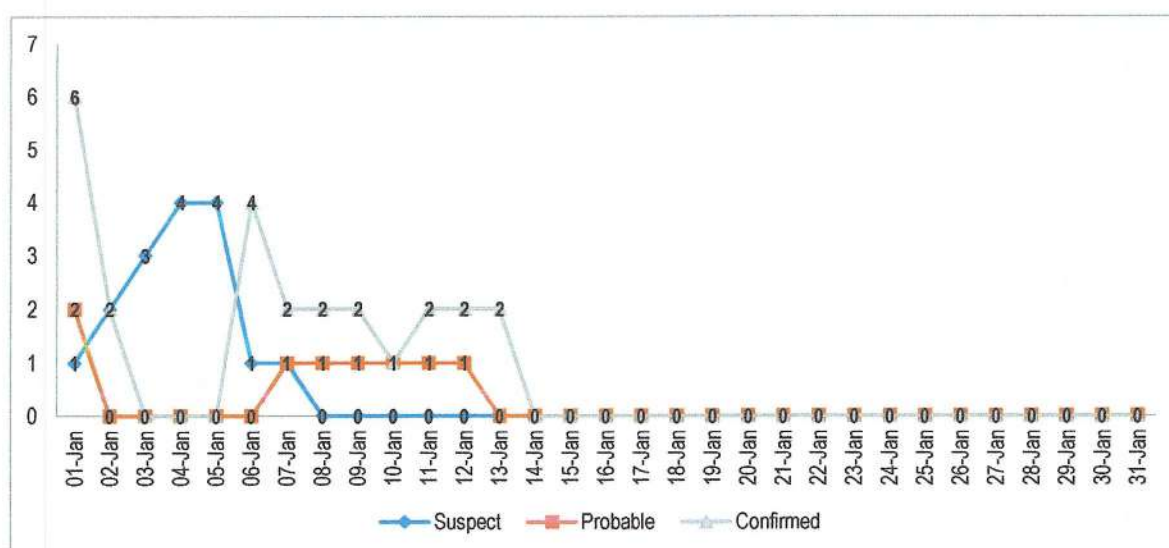


Figure 1. Admissions in the different TTMF in the municipalities of Isabela in January 2023

There were no reported admissions in the City / Municipal Local Government Units' TTMFs for January as seen in Figure 1. This report is consistent with the low admissions from the previous month which only ranged from 0 to 6 patients in a day in the first half of December, and none for the rest of the month. COVID-19 related cases reported this month were either isolated or quarantined at home or in the hospitals.

Disaggregated category of daily COVID-19-related admissions in the seven (7) provincially-maintained hospitals for January 2023

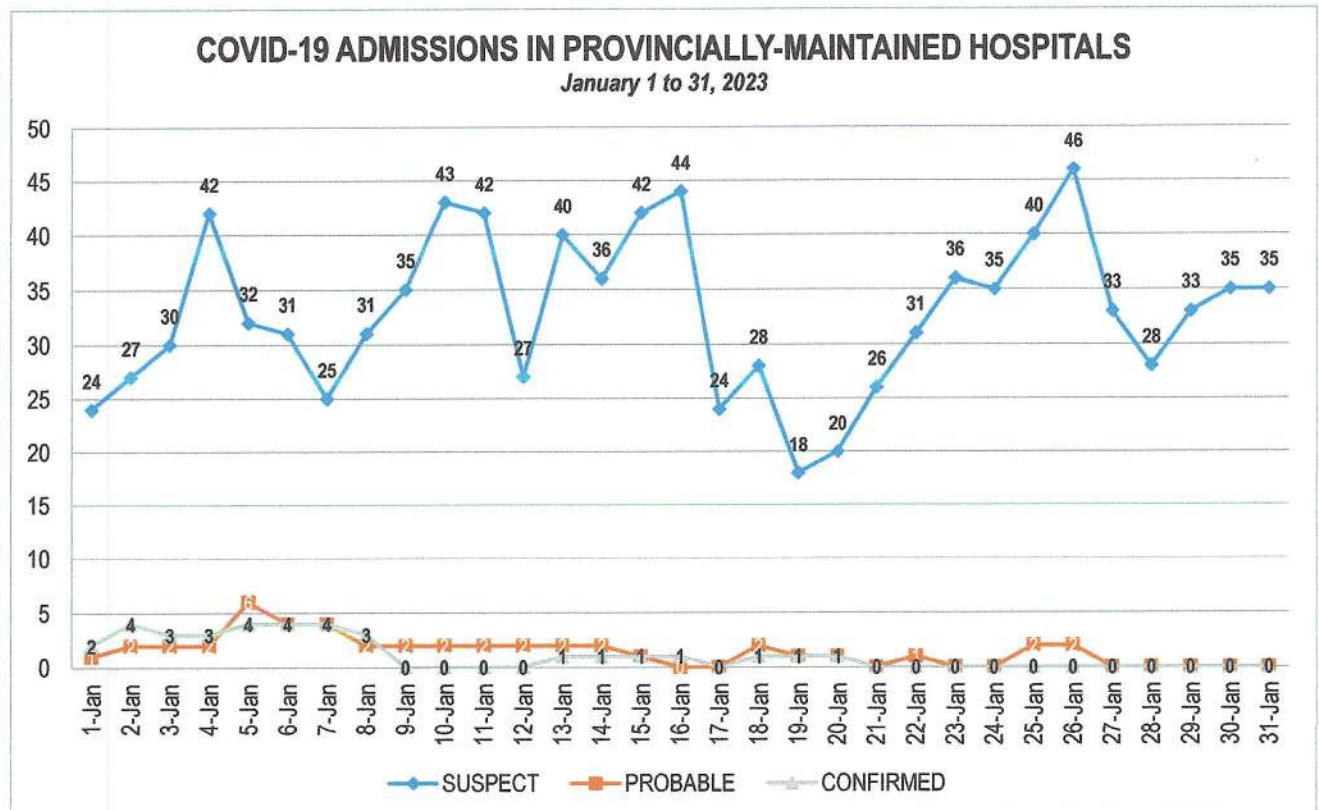


Figure 2. Total daily COVID 19-related admissions in the seven (7) PGI hospitals for the month of January 2023

Figure 2 shows that in the provincially-maintained hospitals, most COVID 19-related admissions for the month were suspect cases ranging from a total of 18 to 46 patients daily. Meanwhile, the number of day-to-day admissions for probable and confirmed cases was not far from each other; patients tagged as probable varied from 0 to 6 total patients per day, while confirmed cases range from a total of 0 to 4. The full report on the specific number of COVID patients per category as to their hospital of admission is contained in Table 2.

Gaps and Delays identified:

Delay in Decision to Seek Care

- Delaying scheduled pre-natal check-up
- Non-compliant to ordered laboratory examinations

Delay in Reaching Care

- Patients were not transferred to a higher facility for further management due to the late decision of the members of the immediate family.
