**NATIONAL TUBERCULOSIS PREVENTION AND CONTROL PROGRAM**

Key Updates to the Current Treatment Guidelines for Programmatic Management of Drug Resistant Tuberculosis

Designed to provide revisions to the treatment regimens of drug resistant tuberculosis among healthcare workers and supervisors. This activity is as well aimed to strengthen the knowledge of participants on the updated treatment guidelines for Multi-drug Resistant Tuberculosis (MDR-TB) set forth by the WHO and the TB Alliance and Tropical Disease Foundation with the DOH.

Conducted and facilitated by CVCHD and Philippine Business and Social Progress (PBSP) where C/MHOs, NTP Coordinators from the IDOTS facilities of the province and NTP Technical staff of IPHO participated in the activity.

Updates on the treatment for the Rifampicin-resistant/Multidrug-resistant /Pre-extensively Drug-resistant Tuberculosis was thoroughly discussed by resource persons from the Lung Center of the Philippines.

The cities and municipalities of City of Ilagan (128), Echague (98), Jones (57), Cordon (53), Cauayan City (44), and Roxas (43) recorded the highest number of cases while Sta. Maria is the sole municipality with zero dengue suspect case.
