In the Province of Isabela, the Provincial Nutrition Evaluation Team (PNET) is composed of the Provincial Nutrition Committee – Technical Working Group (PNC-TWG) represented by the offices of IPHO, OPA, PVET, PPDO, PBO, PSWDO, DILG, and DEPED.

Attendance to the 1st Philippine Cervical Cancer Elimination Summit with the theme, "One Community Against HPV" at Novotel Hotel, Quezon City (May 16, 2024)

Spearheaded by Merck and Dohme Sharp (MSD) in the Philippines, the initiative provided a platform for healthcare experts, advocacy groups, policymakers, and private sectors to accelerate progress toward cervical a cancer-free future for millions of Filipino women.

The World Health Organization (WHO) launched the Global Strategy in 2020 to Accelerate the Elimination of Cervical Cancer as a Public Health Problem with the following targets to be reached by 2030:

- 90% of girls fully vaccinated with HPV vaccine by age 15 years.
- 70% of women are screened with a high-performance test by 35 years of age and again by 45 years of age.
- 90% of women identified with cervical disease receive treatment.

For the Province of Isabela, through the National Immunization Program has commenced its part on this strategy since 2023, with 16,248 or 16.21% of adolescent girls immunized against HPV to date.
