## INFECTIOUS DISEASES CLUSTER

### A. NATIONAL TUBERCULOSIS IS PREVENTION AND CONTROL PROGRAM

Orientation on National Tuberculosis Control Program Manual of Procedures (MOP), 6<sup>th</sup> Edition for Health Workers at San Mariano, Isabela

The orientation aims to enhance the knowledge, skills and competencies of their health workers in effectively implementing the National Tuberculosis Control Program by ensuring accurate screening, diagnosis, treatment and monitoring of tuberculosis (TB) cases in the municipality. Strengthening the capacity of local health workers will contribute in improving the quality of TB care and control efforts in the community.

The resource speakers for the orientation were members of the Provincial NTP Core Team from the Isabela Provincial Health Office. Their expertise and experience in TB management provided valuable insights into the practical application of the MOP guidelines.

Mandatory TB Notification Monitoring (MTBN)

The Mandatory TB Notification Monitoring and Provision of Technical Assistance initiative aims to strengthen the implementation of Republic Act No. 10767, also known as the "Comprehensive Tuberculosis Elimination Plan Act," by ensuring that all public and private healthcare providers comply with the mandatory reporting of tuberculosis (TB) cases. This initiative is crucial in improving TB surveillance, case detection, and programmatic response at all levels of healthcare.

Maternal Death  
Investigation

Maternal death investigation is a part of *Maternal Death Surveillance and Response (MDSR)* - a critical tool in reducing maternal mortality rates. It involves data gathering surrounding the death of a pregnant or a post-partum women. Thorough systematic review of maternal deaths to uncover underlying health, social, and other contributing factors. Lessons learned from this verbal case audit are crucial for making recommendations aimed at preventing similar deaths in the future.

Conducted in the LGU of Cordon on May 13, 2025 where IPHO's MDSR Committee conducted a thorough investigation of a reported pregnancy-related death. Result of the activity will be related to the Municipal Health officer who was then on training.

## **NUTRITION PROGRAM**

Training on the Basic Course for Barangay Nutrition Scholars

The Municipal Nutrition Committees in the province respectively spearheads the conduct of a BNS Basic Course training to capacitate and enhance their BNSs in effectively delivering health and nutrition services, and providing assistance in other related activities, for the community.

Facilitated and served as resource persons during the training in the following municipalities:

- Gamu, Isabela: 15 over 16 BNSs trained,
- Mallig, Isabela: 18 over 18 BNSs trained.

Training on Nutrition in Emergencies and Information Management (NiE-IM) with Philippine Integrated Management of Acute Malnutrition (PIMAM) Orientation

As a follow-up activity to the onsite monitoring conducted by UNICEF Philippines in the past month, they are inviting the province and the three (3) priority municipalities for a training on NiE-IM.

Coordinated the invitation of participants from Reina Mercedes, Cordon, and San Isidro, as well as the participants from the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO) and Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO).

Allocation of supplies and commodities of Nutrition Program

Supplies and commodities are downloaded to the Provincial Health Office - Isabela from the Department of Health (Central Office and Cagayan Valley Center for Health Development). The Property Transfer Reports are forwarded from the IPHO Supply Office to the respective Program Managers for their allocation to the 39 Primary Care Facilities in the province.

Endorsed the allocation of the following to the IPHO Supply Office;

- 3,150 sachets of Ready-to-Use Supplementary Food for pregnant/lactating/postpartum women;
- 900 sachets of Ready-to-Use Supplementary Food for children.

## NON-COMMUNICABLE DISEASES CLUSTER

### LIFESTYLE-RELATED DISEASE PROGRAM

Training Competency in Cervical Cancer Screening at the Primary Care Level

This activity aims to enable healthcare providers to accurately identify cervical abnormalities and make informed decisions on treatment and referral.

The 3-day training was attended by 44 health care providers comprising of 37 Municipal/City Health Officers, 5 Rural Health Midwives, and 1 Nurse and 1 Midwife from this office.

An actual application of the training was conducted in RHU Iguig, Cagayan where participants are tasked to perform visual inspection of the cervix using acetic acid to at least two patients. All participants were able to merit their certificates of completion.

Planning Workshop for the Healthy Hearts Programme Expansion in Isabela and Santiago City

The Department of Health (DOH) and the World Health Organization (WHO) expanded the reach of the healthy Hearts Programme in the Province of Isabela. This expansion aims to further improve hypertension detection and control at the primary health care level, and support the creation of government programmes and policies that address the risk factors of non-communicable diseases (NCDs).

The Non-Communicable Disease Cluster of IPHO in partnership with the World Health Organization and the CVCHD successfully conducted the activity, attended by 69 (17 Males and 52 Females) participants comprising C/MHOs and NCD coordinators from the Primary Care facilities of the province.

### MENTAL HEALTH PROGRAM

Mental Health in the Workplace

Organized by the Department of Interior and Local Government of Isabela in celebration of the 2025 National Women's Month which aimed to address mental health issues in the workplace to maintain public safety, peace and order, and enhancing local government's capacity to provide essential services to the public.

Ms. Cheryl Grace C. Noriega was invited as Resource Speaker where 74 DILG Isabela personnel (39 women and 34 men) actively participated.

School-Based Mental Health Seminar at Top Achievers Private School Inc.

As a platform in fostering a secure and supportive environment for participants educating students and raising awareness of mental health

Ms. Noriega deeply emphasized key messages on having a strong support system is very important among students. Self-help strategies were discussed along with available hotlines

### **POPULATION AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM**

Population and Development Leadership Course (POPDEV Lead Course): Basic Module

The purpose of the activity is to articulate the emerging population and development issues at the national and local levels and present the significance of Philippine Population and Development Plan of Action (PPD-POA) for 2023-2028 in promoting socio-economic development agenda. It also aims to equip population officers on Bridging Leadership for the prevailing Population and Development (POPDEV) issues in their respective localities.

The course was attended by twenty-eight (28) Provincial, City, and Municipal Population officers from the various municipalities across Region 02 and personnel from CPD Region 02.

Ms. Rhodora D. Santos, the Population Program Officer of Isabela was chosen to lead the Pledge of Commitment as POPDEV Leaders towards its vision, "Enabling Institutions Towards People-centered Development."

### **ENVIRONMENTAL AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH PROGRAM**

Orientation on issuance of DOH Operational Permit for Water Refilling Stations Cum Orientation on Environmental and Occupational Health for Barangay Health Workers

The orientation was focused on the essential requirements, including business registration documents, water analysis results, sanitary inspection certifications, facility design plans, and employee health certificates. These documents ensure compliance with health standards and underscore the importance of providing safe, high-quality water to the public.

IPHO's Sanitary Inspectors in collaboration with the Municipal Sanitary Officers of LGU Mallig, conducted this 2-day orientation which was attended by water refilling station owners and barangay health workers.

The required documents were clearly discussed for the issuance of Operational Permit issued by the DOH to the water refilling station owners. Core principles of the Environmental Health program was also discussed to the barangay Health Workers and household members which are:

- Water
- Sanitation
- Solid Waste
- Reporting



