<p>UP Isabela Society's Medical Mission 2025: <i>Bayanihan for Better Health: Free Medical Services for Every Juan</i></p>	<p>The mission's primary goal is to address the community's pressing health concerns and provide accessible medical services by delivering basic medical services and consultations to its residents. Furthermore, the activity is aimed at administering preventive healthcare measures, strengthening community awareness about available healthcare resources, and collaborating with local health workers for continuity of care. In its continuing year, Barangay Dy-Abra, Tumauni, Isabela, being one of the farthest barangays that face challenges in accessing basic healthcare was chosen as the beneficiary of this noble cause.</p>	<p>The activity provided free consultations and medications to 257 residents. As part of the preventive healthcare measures, seventy (70) individuals were inoculated with Anti-flu vaccines through the partnership with the Municipal Health Office of Tumauni. The vast number of beneficiaries is the result of the upstanding partnership between the UP IS resident doctors and alumni, the Local Government of Tumauni, the Provincial Government of Isabela through the Integrated Provincial Health Office, RHU Tumauni, Southern Isabela Medical Center, students, and medical volunteers from various health facilities in Isabela.</p>
