SUMMARY

For the Period covered, the Isabela Provincial Jail has a total population of 202 PDLs/Inmates.

I. SITUATION UPDATE:

a. Inmates/detainees Escort/Attending Court Hearing.

- A total of **sixty-five (65)** PDLs/Inmates were escorted attending Court hearings in face to face and thru videoconference in the twelve (12) Regional Trial Courts within the Province.

f. Clean and Green Livelihood Program

- For the Period, clean & green program is being undertaken by the PDLs/Inmates by way of planting different vegetables as their livelihood program, while other were involved in handicraft projects like basket, table and picture frame making, using cogon as their major materials, others were involved in backyard poultry and piggery projects. The maintenance of these projects is being supervised by IPJ personnel.

g. Moral Recovery Program:

- For the period, there are two (2) religious sect conducted moral and spiritual activities to PDLs/inmates.

- For the Period, there are several recreational activities within jail compound to wit:

i. Visitation:

- As of December 19, 2023, “Open Dalaw” policy has already implemented considering that effect of Covid-19 has gradually decreased, however visitors must show proof that they were already vaccinated w/ Covid-19 vaccines.

j. Security Consciousness:

- The installation of CCTV Camera inside and within the perimeter/premises of the IPJ was already completed and is now operational.

II. Other Concern:

- On January 28, 2025, Public Attorney’s Office (PAO), City of Ilagan and The Regional Juvenile Justice and Welfare Committee (RJJWC) conducted jail visitation and interviewed Children in Conflict with the Law (CICL).
- Handicraft projects continuously undertaken by inmates, open for sale to the public the income generated will accrue to prisoner concerned.
- Likewise, inmates who has knowledge in carpentry jobs, continuously accepting furniture making as their source of meager income, carpentry tools was already completed, through the initiative of the Provincial Warden.

III. Problems/Recommendation:

- Lack of fire power.
- The procurement of fire power of this office is requested and highly recommended to upgrade old and primitive hand guns which were issued to the custodial force/prison guard since the activation of Isabela Provincial Jail.
- Additional custodial/prison guard to cope up the increase of PDLs.
