	<p align="center"><b>Educational</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fourteen (14) residents are presently enrolled at the nearby public school, four (4) are elementary</li> </ul>																				

	<b>Services</b>	<p>graders, nine (9) are in secondary school through modular class and one (1) is enrolled in Alternative Learning System (ALS).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provision of P. E. uniforms to four (4) elementary learners, school supplies, and allowances have provided to all residents enrolled in formal education.</li> <li>• Tutorial activity to other children who are non-readers.</li> </ul>
	<b>Health Services</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All admitted residents including two (2) babies have provided with food supplement: multi-vitamins and vitamin-C to boost immune system.</li> <li>• This month, one resident's dependent (baby) was confined at the FNDM Hospital with provision of free laboratory, medicines, and hospital bill likewise assisted and monitored by the In-House Nurse.</li> <li>• In-House Nurse regularly conducted physical examination including checking of height and weight to all residents for health monitoring.</li> <li>• Proper hygiene like proper hand washing, bathing, trimming of nails and others were taught to all residents by the In-House Nurse.</li> </ul>
	<b>Legal Services</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assisted and escorted seven (7) clients to attend court hearings/pre-trial, arraignment, direct examination at the Regional Trial Court Br. 17, 18, 21, 24, &amp; 40.</li> </ul>
	<b>Spiritual Services and Values Inculcation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All residents have their regular group daily prayer and devotion (evening and morning) as part of spiritual formation.</li> <li>• Proper values and manner were taught to all residents.</li> </ul>
	<b>Recreational, Sports and other Socio-Cultural Activities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Last September 26, 2023, Family Week was observed with the theme: "Kainang Pamilya Mahalaga Day".
