<p>Women and Children Protection Center</p>	<p>Home Life Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Total of 22 residents have provided with complete meals/nutritive food, clothing, toiletries and other personal needs. All admitted residents have guided in managing personal care and discovering self-skills. Guided the residents in time management based on daily constructive activities. Conducted monthly meeting with the residents and able to address their issues and concerns. Likewise, review of house rules to maintain smooth relationship among children. Supervised and monitored home life and other daily activities of children. Conducted monthly character building to all the residents and choose the best performer among them to boost moral values and recognized work life experience. This month, one (1) admitted client was referred by the Prosecutor & MSWDO for temporary shelter & protective custody. 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	<p>Psycho-Social Care Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of individual counseling and other psychological wellness activities have accorded to nineteen (19) residents who experienced Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. Four (4) clients have undergone psychological therapy session to registered Psychologist. Mental Health Practitioners have conducted group dynamics to nineteen (19) residents as part of psychological, mental, & emotional healing & recovery. 																				
	<p>Educational Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Given recognition & token to children with academic achievements/awards. Out of fifteen (15) residents enrolled in formal education, two (2) residents have graduated in Elementary and Senior High School. Likewise, out of fifteen (15) learners, three (3) have received Academic Excellence Award – With Honors. 																				

		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> House parents & other staff have assisted the residents in attending moving-up and graduation rites.
	Health Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All admitted residents including two (2) babies have provided with food supplement: multi-vitamins and vitamin-C to boost immune system. One resident was referred to FNDM Hospital for medical check-up with provision of free medicines & consultation. In-house Nurse assisted four (4) residents for dental check-up and extraction of cavities with provision of free medicines. Monthly physical check-up including checking of height and weight to all residents for health monitoring of In-house Nurse. Regular zumba dance was participated by the children and staff every afternoon at the playground area for physical fitness.
	Legal Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The Center Head and two (2) Social Workers have escorted their respective clients in attending court hearings at the Regional Trial Court of Br. 17 and 18. Case managers/Social Workers have attended Diversion Conference at RTC Br. 17 relative to filed criminal case against the alleged accused minor/CICL-Children In Conflict with the Law.
	Spiritual Services and Values Inculcation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All residents have their group daily prayer and devotion (evening and morning). Values formation was accorded to all residents. House Parents have facilitated the Bible sharing together with the residents every weekend.
	Recreational, Sports and other Socio-Cultural Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Utilized existing outdoor playground facilities and table games for recreational & physical activities of the children/residents. Larong Lahi like "sungka", patintero, piko & etc. were instilled to all young residents during their leisure time for fun and socialization. Birthdays and other events were also celebrated. Nutrition Month was celebrated last July 18, 2023 wherein all children have participated in Nutri-jingle contest and Spelling Contest "with a twist". Purpose of this activity is to give awareness on the importance of eating right foods with right quantity and balance nutrition to achieve a healthy body and mind.
	Economic/Livelihood Skills and Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Inculcation on sharing of profit among the residents out of their livelihood activity. Return demo of skills training learned were accorded to some residents. All residents were motivated in joining income generating/livelihood activity like doughnut making, baking and others.
	Financial Assistance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of financial assistance to indigent parents for transportation expenses in going back home for those who came to visit their children in the Residential Care facility.

	<p>Case Management</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One (1) pre-admission, one (1) admission, and one (1) discharge conferences were convened with the Rehabilitation Team and referring parties. • Complete admission requirements have provided by the referring parties. • Completion of case folder of (22 clients) with Intervention Plan, Progress Report, Medical record, Anecdotal and other legal documents. • Conducted two (2) home visits to clients' family for validation of personal data/information, Parenting Capability Assessment Report (potential guardian), and convened pre-discharge conference/planning in preparation for reintegration of client.
