All admitted residents have guided in managing personal care and discovering self-ability. Guided the residents in time management based on daily constructive activities. Conducted monthly meeting with the residents and able to address their issues and concerns. Supervised and monitored home life activities. Conducted monthly character building to all the residents and choose the best performer among them to boost moral values and recognize work life experience. 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	<p>Psycho-Social Care Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of individual counseling and other psychological wellness activities have accorded to 16 residents who experienced Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. Two (2) newly admitted clients have referred for psychological testing assessment while three (3) clients have undergone psychological therapy session to registered Psychologist. Mental Health Practitioners have conducted group dynamics to sixteen (16) residents. 																				
	<p>Educational Services</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fifteen (15) residents have provided with school allowances, supplies, uniforms, and other school needs and projects. House parents have attended classroom meeting to discuss education related issues of learners/children and who are candidates for graduation. Fifteen (15) clients are officially enrolled in public school and college, five (5) of whom are elementary graders, six (6) are in Junior High School, one (1) enrolled in Alternative 																				

		<p>LearningSystem (ALS), two (2) are in Senior High School and one (1) is currently enrolled in College.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • House Parents have assisted six (6) Junior High School students with the submission of the answered learning modules and projects to their respective class advisers.
	Health Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A thirteen months old baby had undergone immunization (MMR vaccine) at the nearby Barangay Health Center. • One resident was referred to FNDM Hospital for medical check-up with provision of free medicines & consultation. • Provision of food supplement/vitamins have provided to all residents and two (2) babies. • Monthly physical check-up including checking of height and weight to all residents for health monitoring of In-house Nurse.
	Legal Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Center Head/Case Manager testified at the Regional Trial Court Br. 21 - Family Court in Santiago City relative to client's filed criminal complaint. • One (1) among the criminal cases filed against the perpetrators was promulgated at the Regional Trial Court Br. 20, Cauayan City with a penalty of Reclusion Perpetua. Likewise, requested a copy of Court Decision for submission to the Office of the Regional Prosecutor. • Five (5) court hearings have attended by the Social Workers, likewise escorted the clients at the Regional Trial Court of Br. 16, 18, 21, 23, and 24. • Assisted minor in filing a criminal complaint at the Office of the City Prosecutor in Cauayan City.
	Spiritual Services and Values Inculcation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All residents have their group daily prayer and devotion (evening and morning). • Values formation was accorded to all residents. • House Parents have facilitated the Bible sharing together with the residents every weekend.
	Recreational, Sports and other Socio-Cultural Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utilized existing outdoor playground facilities. • Larong Lahi like "sungka", patintero, piko & etc. were instilled to all young residents during their leisure time for fun and socialization. • Birthdays and other events were also celebrated. • Regular zumba dance was participated by the staff and children every afternoon at the playground area.
	Economic/Livelihood Skills and Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Return demo of skills training learned were accorded to some residents. • Motivation to residents of skills learned through income generating/livelihood activity like doughnut making, baking and others.
	Financial Assistance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provided financial assistance for transportation expenses of mother in going back home who came to visit the child in WCPC.
	Case Management	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two (2) pre-admission, two (2) admissions, and one (1) pre-discharge conference were convened with the Rehabilitation Team and referring parties. • Complete admission requirements have provided by

		<p>thereferring parties.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Completion of case folder of (21 clients) with Intervention Plan, Progress Report, Medical record, Anecdotal and other legal documents.

	Physical Structure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Replacement of broken glasses (windows). • Installation of Aisle Door (aluminum). • Repair of four (4) rotten door jambs and door (Office of the Center Head). • Installation of transparent acrylic door (bedrooms, kitchen, staff room & counseling room).
	Staff Development	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Center Head & Social Workers attended Webinar – Malayang Talakayan with Social Work Agencies (SWAs) last June 13 to 15, conducted by the DSWD Central Office. • House parents (6), Mental Health Practitioners (2), and other admin staff (7) have attended Advance Training Program for House parents and Caregivers in Residential Care Facilities for Children.
