Supervised and monitored home life management including constructive activities of children. Conducted monthly character building to all the residents and choose the best performer among them to boost moral values and recognize work life experience. Psycho-Social Care Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of therapeutic activities/psychological wellness accorded by the Mental Health Practitioners. Continuation of Psychotherapy of one (1) client. Continuation of Psychological Assessment of one (1) client. Mental Health Practitioners have conducted group dynamics to 16 residents. Social Workers/Mental Health Practitioners have rendered small talk/counseling to clients with PTSD and psychological distress. 																			
	III. Educational Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Fourteen (14) residents are presently enrolled at the nearby public school, four (4) are elementary graders, nine (9) are in secondary school through modular class and one (1) is enrolled in Alternative Learning System (ALS). Nine (9) secondary school took their 1st periodical test. 																			
	IV. Health Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provision of food supplement/vitamins have provided to all residents and two (2) babies. Referred four (4) clients to FNDM Hospital for medical check-up/ consultation, and laboratories, availed of free medicines. Seven (7) residents have undergone dental services like tooth extraction and cleaning. Monthly physical check-up including checking of height and weight to all residents for health monitoring. 																			

	V. Legal Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Court orientation to three (3) clients in preparation for court appearance and direct examination. Likewise, presented clients to handling Prosecutors for briefing of sworn statements and establishing rapport. • Four (4) court hearings have attended by the Social Workers, likewise escorted four (4) clients at the Regional Trial Court of Br. 18,19, and21.
	VI. Spiritual Services and Value Inculcation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All residents have their group daily prayer and devotion (evening and morning). • House Parents have facilitated the Bible sharing together with the residents every weekend.
	VII. Recreational, Sports and other Socio-Cultural Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Utilized existing outdoor playground facilities. • Regular zumba dance was participated by the staff and children every afternoon at the playground area.
	VIII. Economic/ Livelihood Skills and Development.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Residents practices their knowledge on livelihood training on beauty care, baking and sewing. • Motivation of skills learned through income generating/ livelihood activity like doughnut making, baking and others.
