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	<p><b>Psycho-Social Care Services</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Three (3) clients have undergone continuous psychological evaluation to a Psychologist, Dr. Kathreen Joson for further assessment and evaluation.</li> <li>Provision of psychotherapy have provided to six (6) clients with manifested of Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.</li> <li>Mental Health Practitioners, Ms. Alliana Dawn Salmos and Ms. Alyssa Mary Ballesteros conducted counseling to eighteen (18) clients having distress, does self-harming, conflict with co-resident and misbehavior.</li> </ul>																						
	<p><b>Educational Services</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Sixteen (16) residents are presently enrolled in formal education; six (6) are elementary graders, nine (9) are in secondary school through modular class and one (1) is enrolled in Alternative Learning System (ALS).</li> <li>Provision of daily school needs including other expenses for projects are provided to all learners enrolled in formal education.</li> <li>All learners were provided with school allowance for fare going to school and snacks.</li> <li>At least once a week, ALS coordinator Ms. Sharmain S. Jimenez conducted face to face tutorial (ALS modules) with the client.</li> </ul>																						
	<p><b>Health Services</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This month, fourteen clients have experienced cough &amp; colds due to unpredictable weather. In-house Nurse monitored and administered them with appropriate medicines and vitamins. Likewise, they were isolated in the Infirmary Room to prevent spreading of virus.</li> <li>Provision of food supplement/vitamins have provided to all resident including the two (2) babies).</li> <li>Provision of free consultation and medicines at the FNDM</li> </ul>																						

		<p>Hospital have provided to two (2) clients with cough and colds.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• In-House Nurse conducted weekly physical examination including checking of height and weight to all residents for health monitoring.</li> <li>• One (1) client was referred to Optometrist for check-up due to frequent headache &amp; blurring of vision. Provision of eyeglasses was provided to client.</li> </ul>
	<b>Legal Services</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Proper coordination with the PNP-WCPD of Cauayan City and Ilagan City for execution of sworn statement of two minors and filing of additional perpetrators based on latters' disclosure of incidents.</li> <li>• Assisted and escorted two (2) clients in attending court hearings: pre-trial and arraignment at the Regional Trial Court Br. 19 &amp; 23.</li> </ul>
	<b>Spiritual Services and Values Inculcation</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All residents and staff have attended Holy Mass Celebration presided by Fr. Anthony Pizarro to enhance spiritual formation.</li> <li>• Inculcation of spiritual activities through regular group prayer and devotion (evening and morning) were provided to all residents to improved spiritual growth.</li> <li>• Religious group also conduct Bible sharing to all residents for enhancement of spiritual knowledge and relationship with God.</li> </ul>
	<b>Recreational, Sports and other Socio-Cultural Activities</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Welcoming 2024/New Year was simply celebrated with provision of food, gifts, and goodies provided to all residents.</li> <li>• Three (3) residents have celebrated their natal day and afforded them with traditional food and cake (baked by the children).</li> <li>• Utilizing the outdoor facilities, ball games, and other "larong lahi" were introduced to residents to develop self-confidence, social relationship and support system.</li> <li>• The residents were given opportunity to visit the Bambanti Village and Welcome Arc as part of their socio-cultural awareness.</li> </ul>
	<b>Economic/ Livelihood Skills and Development</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All residents were motivated in joining income generating/ livelihood activity like baking &amp; pastry making to toughen know-how.</li> <li>• Inculcation on sharing of profit among the residents out of their livelihood activity.</li> </ul>
	<b>Financial Assistance</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• There are three mothers who came to the Center to visit their children and provided with financial assistance for transportation going back home.</li> </ul>

	<b>Case Management</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Convened three case conferences together with Social Workers for case updates and preparation for reintegration of clients.</li> <li>• One (1) pre-admission also convened with the Rehabilitation Team and referring party - CSWDO.</li> <li>• Completion of case folder of 20 clients with Intervention Plan, Progress Report, Medical Record, Anecdotal/observation, Psychological Report, and other legal documents &amp; records.</li> </ul>
