Continuous provision of individual counseling was provided to three (3) clients having anxiety. Mental Health Professional/Psychologist, Ms. Alliana Dawn Salmos conducted Mental Status Examination to one (1) client having anxiety/depression prior for referral to a Psychiatrist. Provision of Group Dynamics was provided to all residents conducted by the Psychometrician, Ms. Alyssa Mary Ballesteros. It aims for enhancement self-esteem and interpersonal skills of every client. Mental Health Professionals and Social Workers likewise, conducted briefing and psychologically prepared the clients before attending the court hearings for direct and cross examinations. Out of sixteen (16) residents enrolled in formal education & ALS, there are eight (8) learners received an Academic Excellence Award (With Honors) for third quarter. The Houseparents assisted them to received their awards. Continuous collaboration and monitoring with the school teachers was being made by the Center Head for learners' safety and protection in the school premises.
