

<p>PANGANDYO: NATIONAL YOUTH CONVENTION 2024 December 1-4, 2024</p>	<p>The theme “Pangandoy,” according to the National Youth Commission which organized the three-day convention, encapsulates the collective hopes and ambitions of the youth for a brighter future. It serves as a guiding principle for empowering SKs, LYDC, and LYDO leaders to align their initiatives with the aspirations reflected in the Philippine Youth Development Plan 2023-2028.</p> <p>The province of Isabela, through its youth leaders and youth development workers was among the provinces to have the biggest delegation to the Pangandoy: National Youth Convention 2024 at Nasugbu, Batangas on December 1-4, 2024.</p> <p>Some 30 youth leaders from the Sangguniang Kabataan Pederasyon Presidents, Local Youth Development Council members, and Local Youth Development Officers represented the province of Isabela with the support of the Honorable Governor Rodolfo T. Albano III and Vice Governor Faustino G. Dy III.</p> <p>The delegation was led by SK Panlalawigan Pederasyon President and Sangguniang Panlalawigan Ex-Officio Member, Hon. 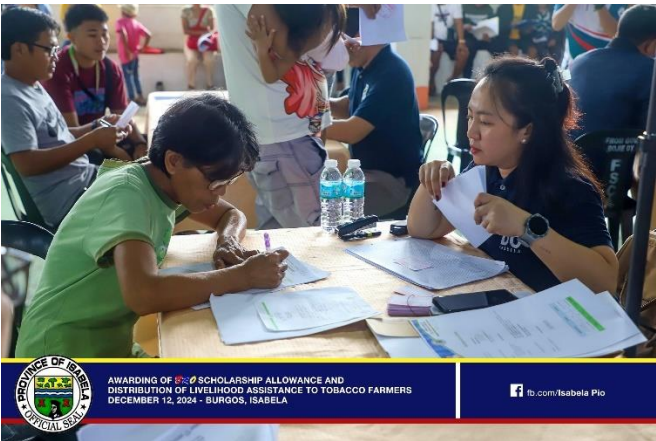

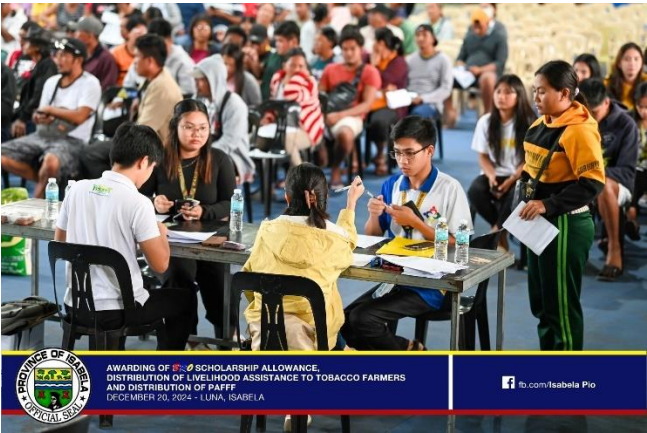
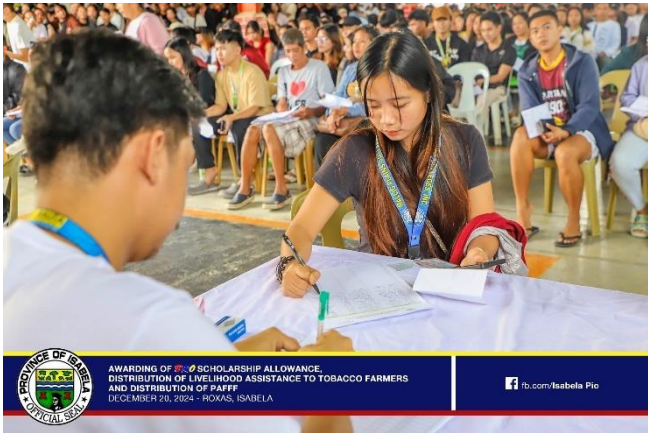
