YOUTH ORGANIZATION REGISTRATION PROGRAM	Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations whose members and operations are under the Provincial Level are encouraged to register to the Youth Organization Registration Program with the same list of requirements necessary to the registration to the National Youth Commission Youth Organization Registered Program (YORP). Once registered under the YORP, the Provincial Youth Development Office, through the PYDO Focal Person on YORP, uploads the required documents of the Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations to the NYC YORP Hub for verification. After which, verified Organizations are given a Unique Registration Number as their identification to the NYC’s database of YOs and YSOs. Organizations need to renew their registration every three years and shall submit an accomplishment report annually.	As of March 2025, Sixty-seven (67) Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations were registered under the Provincial and NYC Youth Organization Registration Program (YORP).

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT MONITORING ON COMPLIANCE TO RA 10742 AND DILG AND NYC POLICIES FOR THE 4 TH QUARTER OF 2024	The Provincial Youth Development Office, in its mandate to provide technical assistance to Local Youth Development Officers and Sangguniang Kabataan Officials, took the initiative to monitor the status of Youth Development work in the province of Isabela through the Local Government Unit's compliance to Republic Act 10742 or the SK Reform Act of 2015, as amended by RA 11768. The monitoring aims to gauge the concerns of the LYDOs and the SKs and to plan what interventions from the PYDO should be prioritized. Moreover, this aims to help the National Youth Commission in their own monitoring activities and confirm the accuracy of the reports from the national office. The provincial government, through the PYDO, specifically monitors the compliance of LGUs, through their LYDOs and SKs to the following: 1. Status of appointment of the Local Youth Development Officers; 2. Status of convening the Local Youth Development Councils; 3. Number of YORP-Registered Youth and Youth-Serving Organizations; 4. Status of approval of the Local Youth Development Plans; 5. Status of account creation to the SK Learning Management System; 6. Number of Quarterly Meetings conducted through the submission of the approved Minutes of the Meeting; and, 7. Submission of the Monitoring and Evaluation reports for the implementation of the Local Youth Development Plans.	As profiled and monitored by the Office for the 4th quarter of 2024, the following information are reported: 1. 12 out of 37 Local Youth Development Officers are appointed; 2. 36 of 37 Local Government Units have convened their Local Youth Development Council; 3. Among the 37 LGUs, Santiago City has the most number of registered organizations, followed by Cauayan City; 4. 28 out of 37 LGUs have an AIP-adopted Local Youth Development Plan; 5. 28 out of 37 LYDOs and SKs have a Youth Organization Registration Program (YORP) Panel; 6. 31 out of 37 LGUs have convened regular quarterly meetings of their Local Youth Development Council; and, 7. 15 out of 37 LGUs have submitted Monitoring and Evaluation Reports of their Local Youth Development Plans. <i>*See Annex D. Grace Arreola, facilitated a committee consultation for the proposed policy on Provincial Education Summit. Among the resource persons present during the consultation are the Provincial Budget Officer, Provincial Treasurer represented by the Assistant Provincial Treasurer, the PYDO, Schools Division Superintendents of DepEd Division Office of Isabela, City of Ilagan, and Cauayan City, together with Parent-Teachers Association Representatives.	The Committee Hearing focused on polishing the proposed ordinance and determining the scope of implementation. The Education Summit aims to identify issues on education from the ground up to the halls of legislation and address these through dialogue and discourse with stakeholders and policymakers. Other details of the proposed Education Summit were also determined and agreed upon during the hearing.

Attended by District Youth Formation Program Coordinators and School Heads, the Provincial Government of Isabela, through the Provincial Youth Development Office, extended technical assistance to the Youth Formation Program of the Schools Division Office of Isabela by facilitating the discussion on Youth Awareness and Involvement in Government Programs during the Capacity Building on Youth Formation Program Implementation. The Office, through Mr. Rey Mel C. Resposo and Ms. Stephanie Mamuri-Fatalla, presented the core youth development programs of the provincial government such as the Bojie-Rodito Opportunities for Education, local Youth Organization Registration Program, and the implementation of the Provincial Youth Development Plan and the Youth Welfare Code of the province. 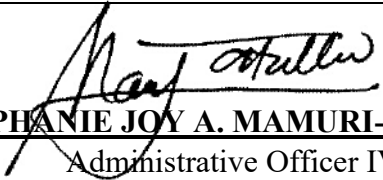
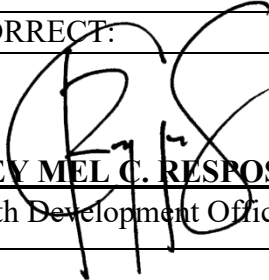

SK-LYDO-PYDC-YORP JOINT 1ST REGULAR QUARTERLY MEETING March 14, 2025	As mandated by RA 10742 or the SK Reform Act of 2015, the Sangguniang Kabataan Federation Presidents, the League of Local Youth Development Officers, the Council NAGKAISA – Provincial Youth Development Council, and all YORP-registered youth and youth-serving organizations in the province of Isabela convened for their Joint 1st Regular Quarterly Meeting for the first quarter of 2025 to discuss the following matters: 1. TESDA Circular No. 026-2025 or the Amended Guidelines on the Conduct of Mandatory Bookkeeping Training for SK Treasurers; 2. Registration to and navigation of the SK Learning Management System and Submission of the Monitoring and Evaluation Form/s; 3. Gender and Development vis-à-vis 2025 Women’s Month Celebration; 4. Consultation for the proposed amendments to the Isabela Youth and Welfare Code; 5. Presentation of 2024 Youth Development Annual Accomplishment Report; 6. Youth Development Monitoring; and, 7. Karla Louise Dioquino-Agbayani, PGI’s Assistant Provincial Legal Officer, delivered an informative and inspiring talk on Gender and Development. Mr. Rey Mel C. Resposo, PYDC Head Secretariat, facilitated the consultation for the proposed

		amendments to the Isabela Youth and Welfare Code while Ms. Stephanie Mamuri-Fatalla presented the PGI's Youth Development Accomplishment Report for 2024. The Office, through Ms. Stephanie Joy A. Mamuri-Fatalla, delivered a lecture on Youth and Active Citizenship zooming in on the Provincial Youth Development Plan (PYDP) as an anchorage of youth-initiated and led programs and activities within the realms of student leadership and the community outside the University. 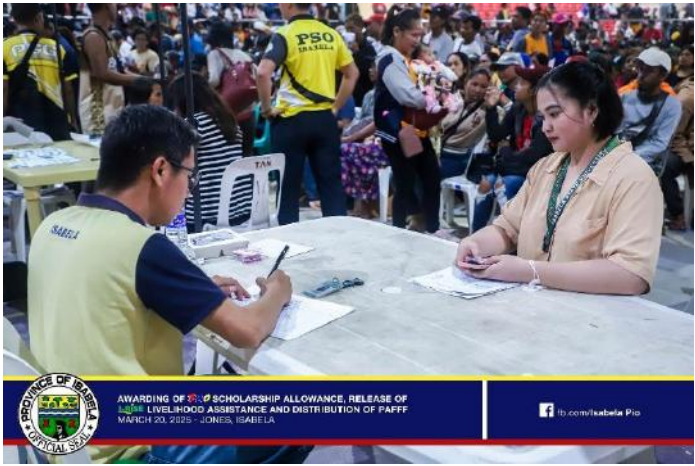

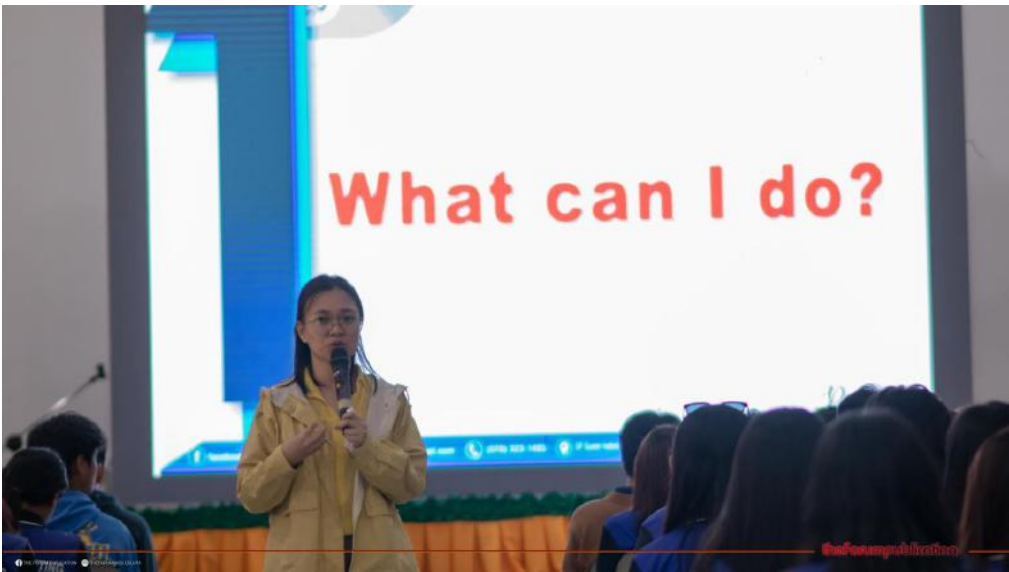
